How can you collage an animal?

Subject Specific Vocabulary	
Collage	Collage describes both the technique and the resulting work of art in which pieces of paper, photographs, fabric and other ephemera are arranged and stuck down onto a supporting surface
texture	How a surface feels to the touch.
fold	Bend something flat over on itself.
crumple	Crush a material so it becomes creased or wrinkled.
overlap	Cover the edge of a material.
tear	Rip carefully in a controlled way.
layering	Arranging materials in layers, often overlapping.

New Skills

- Add collage to a painted, printed or drawn background
- Use a range of media to create collages
- Use different techniques, colours and textures etc when designing and making pieces of work
- Use collage as a means of extending work from initial ideas

Previous Skills

- Create images from a variety of media e.g. photocopies material, fabric, crepe paper, magazines etc
- Arrange and glue materials to different backgrounds
- Sort and group materials for different purposes e.g. colour texture
- Fold, crumple, tear and overlap papers
- Work on different scales
- Colour: Collect, sort, name match colours appropriate for an image
- Shape: Create and arrange shapes appropriately
- Texture: Create, select and use textured paper for an image
- Experiment with a range of collage techniques such as tearing, overlapping and layering to create images and represent textures
- Use collage as a means of collecting ideas and information and building a visual vocabulary
