# St George's Central CE Primary School and Nursery

#### Newsletter – Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> August 2020

Welcome back to school everyone and a special welcome to all our new Nursery and Reception families. I hope you have all had a restful summer and have managed to enjoy getting out and about as much as possible. We have been working hard over the last few weeks to ensure that we have everything ready for your children returning to school. As your children return, they will hopefully also see some additions to our school environment, as we have used the time since March to:



-have a new trim trail installed on the school field;
-have two large 'gazebos' installed on the playground;
-have the area outside Mrs Jeffries' room tarmaced;
-have new resources installed in the outdoor area used by Nursery;
-upgrade our football posts on the school field;
-purchase Kindles and 'state of the art' filming and recording equipment;
-have all of the lighting throughout school upgraded.



Many thanks to all members of staff who put themselves forward to come into school for the first four weeks of the summer holidays to continue with teaching and learning activities for our children. Our aim with this was to provide an opportunity for more children to access learning in school prior to returning in September. Thanks again to the staff involved:



#### Arrangements for the return to school for all children: Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2020

Currently the Government Guidance is that schools will open for all children and so we are emailing you this 'lengthy' newsletter today so that you are fully aware of our plans for when we re-open to all children next week. Home visits for Darlington Street Nursery children and Reception children have been cancelled and so **all children** will be starting on Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2020. On this day, school will re-open fully to all children and any previous arrangements to limit school places during the Coronavirus pandemic will no longer be in effect.

Attendance for all children is mandatory from the beginning of the Autumn Term, including for children who have previously, so far, been advised to shield at home. Children who are self-isolating due to quarantining or presenting with symptoms of Coronavirus, or have been exposed to somebody presenting with symptoms of Coronavirus, must not attend school until the self-isolation period has passed or they test negative for Coronavirus (for those quarantining, then it is the specified days from the time of returning). **If your child** presents with Coronavirus symptoms, the self-isolation period is 10 days; **if a member of your household** presents with Coronavirus symptoms, the self-isolation period for your child is 14 days.

In devising the plans for both our sites, we have used key documents from the Local Authority and The Department of Education as well as our experience of when we were partially open to children during the Summer Term. Please note, we do have a contingency plan in place in case of any partial school, whole school, local or national lockdowns.

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#### **General information**

We have been provided with a Generic Risk Assessment from Wigan Council and also have a specific St. George's Central CE Primary School and Nursery Risk Assessment in place.

Please ensure that you adhere to, and manage, your own social distancing measures in and around our sites when arriving and leaving. School staff will be on hand to support you with this.

Please avoid congregating anywhere along the pavement outside school, especially if you arrive before the time that classroom doors will be opened. You will only be permitted to enter our school site, each morning and at hometime, **once school staff are present outside the school gates.** 

Children should wear their full school uniform.

Both our sites will have a 'one way' system in place for accessing and leaving.

A hand sanitiser station is positioned on the entrance to school and must be used by all staff and visitors on arrival.

In order to prevent congestion, we have avoided giving each year group an allotted time to enter school. We have tried to make it simple to keep movement flowing in that, as soon as you arrive and you are allowed to enter the site......head for the classroom door and let your child walk straight into their classroom.

At school, all children will be entering our site at the main gates and leaving via the 'Peel Hall' gates.

Each morning, there will be a member of staff on each school gate (including the car park) and on the school playground to facilitate children safely entering our school.

Your child's teacher will let your child know the specific day they will be required to wear their PE kit to school for their outdoor PE lesson (this will be from **Monday 7<sup>th</sup> September** onwards).

When you enter our sites please avoid touching or accessing any of our resources (including fixed equipment).

Packed lunches can be brought to school as normal (a disposable bag would be ideal). There should be no need to bring any other bags.

Enhanced cleaning of play equipment/resources and frequently touched surfaces will be taking place throughout the school day.

Should you wish to speak to any of our staff (including the school office or nursery office), please telephone or email.

No medicines will be administered in school until further notice.

Again, in order to prevent congestion, we have avoided giving each year group an allotted time to leave school. As soon as you arrive (2:45pm for nursery and 3:00pm for all other classes)......your child should be ready and they will leave as staff see you.

Collective Worship will take place in classrooms/small groups.

Children will need to bring their own water bottle as cups will not be in place for use at the water coolers.


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
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
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
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#### Other information

On arrival children will wash their hands and regular hand washing in small groups will take place throughout the day.

Resources used will be rotated and will be regularly cleaned.

Regularly used surfaces and other equipment will be wiped down throughout the day.

Outdoor areas will be used as much as possible.

Staff will remain in their own room/area with their own children as much as possible throughout the day.

Staggered playtimes/lunchtimes are organised with each group of children playing together with their own equipment to use, within their own area of the playground to minimise the chance of children/adults mixing groups.

Hot meals will be prepared for children on school dinners.

Seating at lunchtime will be organised to minimise the chance of children/adults mixing groups.

Please ensure you become familiar with the classroom doors your children will be entering through and leaving from and the times that they are open for you. As we will now be fully opening to all year groups, staff outside school will need to 'keep people moving' so as to safely manage the arrival and departure of over 300 children. Therefore please support us with this and make use of phone/email methods of communication as opposed to spending time explaining any specific issues, particularly near the school gates or classroom doors.

Since March, I have seen our school community come together to further cement our strong partnership. As a result of this, I think that your children will be great when they return to school! Those children starting in our nurseries and those new children starting in Reception will feel like they have been here for years after a few days and those children that have been here for years, will soon be back into the groove!

Keep up the good work – you have done a great job with your children and now we can continue to support each other as we open next week. I can't wait to see you all next Wednesday.
